Chief Weighill began his policing career with the Regina Police Service in 1975, where he worked to achieve the rank of Deputy Chief. On September 1, 2006, he was sworn in as Chief of Saskatoon Police Service. During his 42 year career Chief Weighill's achievements in policing, his contributions to community development and his contributions to fostering relationships between police agencies and Indigenous groups are well documented.

Under his guidance, the Saskatoon Police Service was restructured with officers being redeployed within geographical areas, resulting in increased production, decreased response times, and reduced complaints regarding quality of life issues.

Chief Weighill was tasked with the implementation of the recommendations from the Stonechild Inquiry. Not only were all of the recommendations implemented, they were enhanced and expanded.

Chief Weighill has been a leader in policing locally, provincially, nationally, and internationally. His innovative approaches to building community trust and involvement have been very successful.

Chief Weighill has made an outstanding contribution to law enforcement through his volunteerism and determination to better the Saskatoon Police Service. He is a true leader!
