Cst. Brian Glynn and Cst. Luke Torgunrud are members of the Prince Albert Police Service.

On Nov. 11, 2018, Csts. Glynn and Torgunrud were dispatched to a residence for an attempted suicide call. On arrival at the residence, they observed a male subject inside the residence. The male subject communicated to the officers that they would have to kick the door in and he proceeded to cut his wrist with a knife. The male subject then grabbed a cable wire and hung himself as the Officers were trying to force their way into the residence. Csts. Glynn and Torgunrud continued to kick the door, until the bottom of it gave away allowing Cst. Torgunrud to gain entry.

The male subject was hanging lifeless from the cable wire. Csts. Glynn and Torgunrud got him down, laid him on the floor and were able to resuscitate him and apply a tourniquet to stop further loss of blood.

The quick and unwavering action of Cst. Glynn and Cst. Torgunrud saved this man's life, allowing him to obtain both physical and psychological medical help which he desperately required.
