Sgt. Lockyer has been a member of the RCMP since May 5, 1991. She is presently attached to the CTSS S.E. District as Operations NCO North Team.

On April 6, 2018, Sgt. Lockyer was dispatched to scene of the Humboldt Hockey Bus accident where she took the lead of a massive, complex investigation on behalf of the collision program.

Sgt. Lockyer was the last to leave the collision sight, spending 21 ½ hours with temperatures below -20 with a brisk wind.

Throughout the investigation Sgt. Lockyer worked with Transport Canada, SGI Safety Standards, and the Saskatchewan Highway Patrol, making sure they had what they required to complete their investigation.

She worked closely with the Coroner's Office, updating them on the progress of the investigation and the towing company, making sure that potential evidence in the debris was not destroyed as it was moved to a compound.

Sgt. Lockyer spent many hours working through the data collected at the accident scene, producing a very thorough, detailed and technical Collision Reconstruction Report.

Sgt. Lockyer displayed professionalism, leadership and competence throughout the investigation. She is a tremendous asset to the Collision Reconstruction Program, the RCMP, and the Policing Community in Saskatchewan.
